Hon. Robert K. Rouse Jr. (Ret) is being recognized by the Volusia County Bar Association for 50 years of distinguished service to the legal profession. Born in Lexington, Kentucky, and raised in Daytona Beach since 1955, he practiced as a civil trial lawyer for 20 years before his appointment to the bench in 1995. He served for two decades as a circuit judge in the Florida Seventh Judicial Circuit, including two terms as Chief Judge, and also sat by assignment with the Florida Fifth District Court of Appeal. He also authored the “Principles of Professionalism for Florida Judges,” unanimously adopted by all Florida courts, underscoring his enduring commitment to judicial professionalism.




## **George Pappas**

# VCBA PRESIDENT'S BRIEF

## President's Brief: Artificial Intelligence and Attorney-Client Privilege — Recent Federal Authority

Members of the Volusia County Bar Association:

Recent federal authority has addressed a question many of us have been evaluating in real time: whether communications with general-purpose artificial intelligence platforms are protected by the attorney-client privilege or work-product doctrine.

In *United States v. Heppner*, No. 1:25-CR-00503-JSR (S.D.N.Y. Feb. 17, 2026) (Rakoff, J.), the United States District Court for the Southern District of New York held that materials generated through a publicly available AI platform and later shared with counsel were not protected by attorney-client privilege or the work-product doctrine. The court reasoned that use of the AI system constituted disclosure to a third party outside the privileged attorney-client relationship. Because confidentiality is a foundational requirement of privilege, voluntary disclosure to a third party may result in waiver.

The decision reinforces longstanding doctrine. The attorney-client privilege protects confidential communications between attorney and client made for the purpose of seeking or rendering legal advice. *Upjohn Co. v. United States*, 449 U.S. 383 (1981). Voluntary disclosure of privileged communications to a third party generally waives the privilege. See, e.g., *United States v. Mejia*, 655 F.3d 126 (2d Cir. 2011). The Heppner court further rejected the argument that privilege could be “restored” simply because AI-generated material was later transmitted to counsel; once confidentiality is compromised, the protection cannot be retroactively recreated.

Some practitioners have asked whether the Kovel doctrine may extend privilege to AI systems used to assist counsel. See *United States v. Kovel*, 296 F.2d 918 (2d Cir. 1961). Courts have made clear that privilege may extend to third-party agents only when they function as necessary intermediaries in facilitating legal advice within a confidential framework. Casual or independent use of public-facing AI tools does not automatically satisfy that standard.

Florida practitioners should also consider Florida Bar Ethics Advisory Opinion 24-1 (Jan. 19, 2024). While non-binding, Opinion 24-1 confirms that lawyers may use generative AI in their practices but must do so consistent with the Rules Regulating The Florida Bar, including:

- Rule 4-1.1 (Competence), requiring lawyers to understand the benefits and risks associated with relevant technology;
- Rule 4-1.6 (Confidentiality of Information), requiring reasonable safeguards against unauthorized disclosure; and
- Rules governing supervision and communication.

Taken together, recent federal authority and Florida ethical guidance make several practical points clear:

- AI tools are assistive technologies, not privileged communication channels.
- Inputting confidential or identifiable client information into public AI platforms may constitute disclosure to a third party.
- All AI-generated research, citations, and drafting must be independently reviewed and verified by counsel.
- Firms should evaluate internal policies, data-handling practices, and client engagement language regarding technology use.

Artificial intelligence is rapidly becoming integrated into legal research and drafting workflows. Used thoughtfully and under appropriate safeguards, it can enhance efficiency and access to information. Used carelessly, it can create avoidable risk.

As officers of the court and stewards of client confidences, we remain responsible for ensuring that innovation proceeds hand-in-hand with professional judgment and ethical compliance.

The Solo and Small Practice Section of the VCBA is preparing for an upcoming CLE on March 10, 2026 that will specifically address this emerging law. If there is interest, the Association will organize a CLE devoted to AI governance, privilege preservation, and practical guardrails for Florida practitioners. To ensure receipt of voting-related emails, members should add [noreply@directvote.net](mailto:noreply@directvote.net) as an approved sender through their IT department. Members who do not receive an election-related email should contact [support@directvote.net](mailto:support@directvote.net). Members who have provided The Florida Bar with a law firm email address that is not unique to them, such as a shared inbox, will not receive emails from SBS.

On January 5, all eligible members in good standing with unique email addresses received an email from SBS asking whether they prefer to vote by paper ballot. ## VCBA SCAM ALERT

Dear VCBA Member,

We want to make you aware of an increase in scam attempts targeting our members, particularly through email communications. These messages are becoming more sophisticated and often appear to come from legitimate sources, including colleagues, court personnel, or bar leadership.

Please exercise heightened caution when reviewing and responding to emails, especially those that:

- Request urgent action, wire transfers, or changes to payment instructions
- Ask you to click unfamiliar links or download unexpected attachments
- Appear to come from a known contact but contain unusual language or requests
- Involve client funds, trust accounts, or settlement disbursements

Best practices include:

- Carefully reviewing the sender's full email address (not just the display name)
- Verifying requests by calling or emailing the sender at a known, trusted phone number or email address
- Avoiding the use of links embedded in suspicious emails

We encourage all members to remain vigilant and to remind your staff of these risks as well. Proactive awareness remains the most effective defense.
